PTSD Awareness Month

June is PTSD Awareness Month, which aims to bring greater awareness to posttraumatic stress disorder. First Responders are twice as likely to suffer from PTSD.

PSHSA would like to thank all of our clients and stakeholders who took part in the PTSD Awareness and Anti-Stigma Awareness needs assessment survey. 127 clients participated in the survey representing the fire, police, EMS, corrections, dispatch, health and community care, education and municipal sectors. 55% of respondents identified that they had a regional dispersed workforce and 76% of the respondents identified that eLearning would be a valuable training method that would meet the organizations awareness training needs regarding these topics. PSHSA is further analyzing the results and will start development of these training modules. We look forward to helping you implement your PTSD Prevention Plan elements.

PTSD and Chronic Mental Stress Webinar Series

PSHSA will be offering a series of webinars to help workplaces implement their PTSD Prevention Plan elements and promote prevention activities in your workplace.

We know that exposure to chronic mental stress is known to have negative effects on employee health and behaviours. Understanding factors associated with job stress provides opportunities for intervention by changing work practices and prevention by building resilience. Resilience generally describes characteristics or capacities enabling individuals and organizations to recover from adversity and use available resources adaptively...the ability to "bounce back". Learn specific actions workplaces can take to build resilience.

Coming Soon: JHSC Certification Refresher

PSHSA will soon be offering Joint Health and Safety Committee Certification Refresher. To become fully certified JHSC members, participants successfully complete both the JHSC Certification Part 1 Training Program and JHSC Certification Part 2 (Sector-



Specific or Workplace-Specific hazard training). To support ongoing learning for certified members, the new Program Standard has introduced Refresher Training. Those certified by the CPO under the new training and other requirements established on October 1, 2015 are required to take Refresher Training every three years to maintain certification. Completion of the JHSC Refresher program will renew an individual's certification status and maintain the certification under guidelines established and enforced by the Ministry of Labour.

Appropriate for all sectors, this program is intended as a

refresher to the Certification Part 1 and Certification Part 2 training programs.

Bill 127 Chronic Mental Stress

Bill 127 was passed by the government on May 17, 2017 to come into effect January 1, 2018. This new legislation allows compensation for work related chronic mental stress. The WSIB is undergoing consultation on the new Traumatic Mental Stress Policies which proposes the following entitlement criteria: 1) Diagnostic Requirements - there must be a diagnosis under the Diagnostic and Statistical manual of Mental Disorders by an appropriate regulated health professional; 2) Entitlement may be granted for chronic mental stress caused by a substantial work-related stressor including workplace bullying or harassment and the stressor must be excessive in comparison to normal pressures/tensions experienced by workers in similar circumstances; and 3) The substantial work-related stressor must have significantly contributed to the chronic mental stress for there to be an entitlement. 

Ministry of Labour and Ministry of Education Initiative on Workplace Violence

For the 2017-18 school year, the Ministry of Labour (MOL) will be conducting an enhanced initiative on workplace violence in schools. All district schools in Ontario will be visited by an enforcement team that may include a manager, regional program co-ordinator and an inspector to review school boards' obligation under the Occupational Health and Safety Act (OHSA).

To better inform inspectors and workplace parties on compliance with the OHSA as it relates to workplace violence, MOL will be issuing guidance documents in collaboration with the Education Provincial Working Group. The development of a guidance documents will be supported by a secretariat led by MOL and by the Public Service Health and Safety Association.

PSHSA was in attendance at the Coroner's Inquest, which highlighted the need for standardized curriculum for NFPA training. The inquest findings generated recommendations to help improve public safety and prevent deaths in similar circumstances. PSHSA will be working in collaboration with stakeholders to take all recommendations and outcomes of the Inquest into consideration. By observing and contributing to the changes needed, PSHSA will work to model the core values of the fire service such as integrity, compassion, courage, teamwork, service and accountability.

Traffic Protection Emergency Services Classroom

PSHSA is updating the Traffic Protection for Emergency Services course. This course is designed for Emergency Services workers who are exposed to traffic hazards and work on or near roadways for emergency response purposes. This program covers the hazards of working close to vehicles and equipment, the legislation that applies to specific



situations and how emergency services workers can protect themselves from these hazards. This program covers the application of the Ontario Traffic Manual Book 7 including guidance for dealing with unplanned events specific to Emergency Services.

Public Review of CSA Z8000

The draft new edition of CSA Z8000 Canadian Healthcare Facilities is now at the Public Review stage. Since it was first released in 2011, this standard has been used in Canadian healthcare facility planning, design, and construction. The current draft reflects the best efforts of the committees that developed it, attempting to target the main infection control section and IPAC throughout the document. The 60-day Public Review process is meant as a way to receive input from the broader healthcare community. To review the draft and post comments, visit CSA Group Public Review.

Shelly will outline the who, what, where, when, why and how requirements of an Incident/Accident Reporting Program. Influenza and Outbreaks Webinar - Demystifying your Responsibilities

Respiratory tract infections (like influenza) are commonly diagnosed infections in long-term care homes and outbreaks of these illnesses are very disruptive to operations and normal "life" at affected organizations. They pose a health risk to both residents and staff. As a result of this dual risk, both the Ministry of Health & Long Term Care and Ministry of Labour have expectations that workplaces must follow. In this presentation, PSHSA and Public Health Ontario will "demystify" the reporting requirements to both Ministries and highlight the importance of early detection together with the timely implementation of outbreak control measures to minimize transmission of infection for the protection of staff and residents alike.
